Desiree Kaur

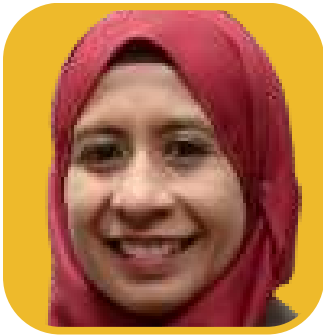
